Term 1	Living	L2.8 What does it mean to be a Hindu in Britain today? L2.9 What can we learn from religions about deciding what is right and wrong?	<ul> <li>Identify and name examples of what Hindus have and do in their families and at mandir to show their faith</li> <li>Ask good questions about what Hindus do to show their faith</li> <li>Describe some ways in which Hindus express their faith through puja, aarti and bhajans.</li> <li>Recall and talk about some rules for living in religious traditions.</li> <li>Find out at least two teachings from religions about how to live a good life.</li> <li>Give examples of ways in which some inspirational people have been guided by their religion.</li> </ul>

Term 2	Believing	L2.3 Why is Jesus inspiring to some people	<ul> <li>Ask questions raised by the stories and life of Jesus and followers today, and give examples of how Christians are inspired by Jesus.</li> <li>Suggest some ideas about good ways to treat others, arising from their learning.</li> <li>Describe how Christians celebrate Holy Week and Easter Sunday</li> <li>Identify the most important parts of Easter for Christians and say why they are important</li> </ul>
Term 3	Living	L2.7 What does it mean to be a Christian in Britain today?	<ul> <li>Describe some examples of what Christians do to show their faith, and make connections with some Christian beliefs and teachings.</li> <li>Describe some ways in which Christian express their faith through hymns and modern worship songs.</li> <li>Suggest at least two reasons why being a Christian is a good thing in Britain today, and two reasons why it might be hard sometimes.</li> <li>Discuss links between the actions of Christians in helping others and ways in which people of other faiths and beliefs, including pupils themselves, help others.</li> <li>Explain similarities and differences between at least two different ways of worshipping in two different Christian churches</li> </ul>

Term 1	Believing	L2.1 What do different people believe about God? (Christian and Muslim focus)	<ul> <li>Describe some of the ways in which Christians Hindus and/or Muslims describe God.</li> <li>Ask questions and suggest some of their own responses to ideas about God.</li> <li>Suggest why having a faith or belief in something can be hard.</li> <li>Identify how and say why it makes a difference in people's lives to believe in God.</li> <li>Identify some similarities and differences between ideas about what God is like in different religions.</li> </ul>
	Believing	L2.2 Why is the bible so important for Christians today?	<ul> <li>Make connections between stories in the Bible and what Christians believe about creation, the Fall and salvation.</li> <li>Give examples of how and suggest reasons why Christians use the Bible today.</li> <li>Describe some ways Christians say God is like, with examples from the Bible, using different forms of expression.</li> <li>Discuss their own and others' ideas about why humans do bad things and how people try to put things right.</li> <li>Explain how the Bible uses different kinds of stories to tell a big story</li> </ul>
Term 2	Expressing	L2.5 Why are festivals important to religious communities? (Easter focus)	<ul> <li>Make connections between stories, symbols and beliefs with what happens in at least two festivals.</li> <li>Ask questions and give ideas about what matters most to believers in festivals (e.g. Easter, Eid).</li> <li>Identify similarities and differences in the way festivals are celebrated within and between religions.</li> <li>Explore and suggest ideas about what is worth celebrating and remembering in religious communities and in their own lives.</li> <li>Suggest how and why religious festivals are valuable to many people.</li> </ul>
Term 3	Expressing	L2.4 Why do people pray?	<ul> <li>Describe the practice of prayer in the religions studied.</li> <li>Make connections between what people believe about prayer and what they do when they pray .</li> <li>Describe ways in which prayer can comfort and challenge believers.</li> <li>Describe and comment on similarities and differences between how Christians, Muslims and Hindus pray.</li> </ul>
	Expressing	L2.6 Why do some people think that life is a journey and what significant experiences mark this?	<ul> <li>Recall and name some of the ways religions mark milestones of commitment (including marriage).</li> <li>Identify at least two promises made by believers at these ceremonies and say why they are important.</li> <li>Suggest why some people see life as a journey and identify some of the key milestones on this journey</li> <li>Describe what happens in Christian, Jewish, and/or Hindu ceremonies of commitment and say what these rituals mean</li> </ul>
