

- Meeting for parents date TBC



Lunch and snack time

- School dinner free to all children under 7
- Packed lunch healthy and limit processed and sugar (recent nutrition and NHS guidance)
- Lunch hour
- Fruit free to under 7s
- Milk free to under 5s (sign up to Cool Milk)
- Water access all day please bring a <u>clearly</u> named water bottle to school every day

What does my child need at school?

- Coat with hood (woolly hats, gloves, scarf, sunhats to match weather all named)
- Wellies to leave in school (named)
- Book bag Please bring everyday so letters, library books, reading books, phonics... can be transported safely
- Water bottle (<u>clearly named</u>) we request this is water not juice tooth decay and also not spillable
- PE kit come to school in PE kit (day TBC)

Nutrition and Health

Recent Guidance aims to help children build a strong relationship with food and make healthy choices to tackle both **obesity** and **tooth decay**.

We offer fresh fruit and milk/water at snack times.

Please only fill water bottle with plain tap water – juice has a high sugar content and contributes to tooth decay.

Packed lunches Please consider providing healthy foods and limit foods high in sugar or salt and saturated fat.

If it is you child's birthday, we ask you <u>not</u> to provide sweets for the class as we continue to promote health eating habits.

We talk about tooth brushing and healthy eating in school and encourage our families to promote this at home too.

Allergies and Intolerances – please make us aware of these as soon as possible

Early Language

Research is suggesting children are starting school with fewer language skills than in previous years.

Contributing factors may include: working families, busy households, screens and the fast pace of our world.

You can help you child by:

- Limiting screen time for children and adults
- **Storytelling** make up stories, share books (not on screens) talk about characters and feelings
- Songs and rhymes sing songs and nursery rhymes to develop phonological awareness as well as rhyme and rhythm
- -Talk and Listen back and forth conversations listen attentively, respond thoughtfully, ask questions, value talk.
- Be patient allow your child time to respond, and don't interrupt or finish their sentences.

If you are concerned about your child's speech and language development at any point throughout the year please let us know.

Things to do at home to help with starting school

- Independent skills coats/shoes/toilets/wellies/fidning their belongings
- Eating and peeling whole fruits
- Sharing and turn taking
- Tidying up
- Read lots of books and sing rhymes/poems
- Count and make maths fun
- Be active develop large and fine motor skills
- Have a wonderful summer making memories and talk talk!
